## SCHOOL ALLOCATION MEMORANDUM NO. 80, FY09

**SUBJECT:** **English Language Learner (ELL) Success Incentive Grant**

This memorandum provides resources to schools participating in the ELL Success Incentive Grant. Participating schools were required to submit program proposals which were approved by Maria Santos, Executive Director, Office of English Language Learners (ELLs). School allocations are summarized on the attached table.

This ELL Success Incentive Grant is grounded in the core principles of *Children First* – leadership, empowerment, and accountability – supporting the capacity-building efforts of schools to create strong ELL programs. This grant is the result of collaborative efforts with New York City Council, and a host of advocates and partners. The ELL Success Grant was open to all school leaders who have thoughtfully allocated their fiscal and human resources to increase ELL performance but have identified additional needs.

*Schools receiving the grant must plan new and/or enhance programs in at least one of the following areas for ELLs:*

- **Struggling ELLs:** serving Students with Interrupted Formal Education (SIFE), Long Term ELLs, ELLs in years 4-6, newcomers and Special Education ELLs.
- **Parent options:** creating and/or enhancing Transitional Bilingual Education or Dual language Programs.
- **Teacher quality:** providing professional development on literacy and academic language through institutes such as QTEL and/or rigorous ongoing professional development to content area teachers on research based practices to improve the instruction of ELLs in monolingual programs; enhancing collaboration between content area teachers and ESL bilingual teachers; and/or expanding ELL and bilingual teacher recruitment and hiring in small schools.

Awarded schools must:

- Use funds to supplement existing ELL programs and services provided through the Fair Student Funding Formula, Contract for Excellence, Title I and Title III.
- Use funds to expand services for ELLs other than core mandated CR Part 154 services.
- Identify members of a planning team who will meet regularly on the implementation and execution of grant activities.
- Leverage their internal resources and the support offered by networks and Student Support Organizations to improve their ELL programs.
- Engage the Inquiry Team in the work to support ELLs.
- Have at minimum a weekly period (45 minutes) embedded in the school day for collaborative planning/professional development focused on ELLs.

- Agree to serve as a demonstration site for schools seeking to implement similar school-based practices.
- Agree to be a part of the ongoing evaluation of the ELL Success Incentive program.

Program schools are required to send their designated grant contact person to monthly grant meetings where the Office of ELLs will provide additional support on specific areas of need outlined in their application. Additionally, ELL Curriculum Specialists and Compliance and Performance Specialists from the Office of ELLs will visit each school **at least three times** to support program implementation, evaluate program effectiveness and document best practices.

Allocations will be placed in each school's budget under the allocation category **TL ELL Success Incentive Grants**. Schools should schedule their allotment in accordance with their approved programs.
