SUBJECT: **INQUIRY LEADERSHIP ALLOCATIONS**

This year 72 schools were selected by their Network or SSO to participate in the inquiry leadership initiative. The allocation described in this memo will support leadership development for selected educators engaged in inquiry within their schools.

Inquiry Leadership Process

In FY09 we have deepened the inquiry work by providing opportunities for customization and co-construction of the Inquiry work in SSOs, Networks and schools, including District 97. An integral component of this strategy is utilizing real-time school-level perspectives. This will be achieved by fully involving selected principals and their Inquiry Team teacher leaders in the leadership and design of inquiry work. The approach enhances sustainability through building networks of learning communities within schools and SSOs. The strategy works in two ways:

Participate in inquiry planning and design

- SAFs have invited selected principals and their Inquiry Team teacher leaders to participate in the leadership and design of Children First Intensive (CFI). The newly formed teams provide professional development to each network of schools within the SSO. Throughout the year, the selected CFI principals and teachers will stimulate and facilitate the sharing of best practices throughout the SSO and serve as coaches to others.

Engage in leadership development modules

- Principals and teachers will be brought together monthly in design and implementation meetings to study and learn together through a series of leadership modules.

Funding

This allocation will provide resources to make schools' participation possible. Each participating school will receive \$4,299 in support of the inquiry leadership work. The allowable cost factors will include:
