SUBJECT: **Specialized High School Admissions Testing**

This memorandum describes the resources provided to school locations administering the Specialized High School admissions test.

One of the goals of the Children First reform agenda is to ensure that *all* students have the opportunity to succeed in 21st-century workplaces and communities. New York City's specialized high schools (Bronx High School of Science, Brooklyn Technical High School, Stuyvesant High School, the High School for Math, Science and Engineering at City College, Queens High School for Sciences at York College, Staten Island Technical High School, Brooklyn Latin and High School of American Studies at Lehman College) provide an intensive focus on specific subjects for students who are interested in careers in specific areas.

The allocation below is for testing associated with entrance to the specialized schools (not with school costs). Testing site schools will be expected to provide a detailed account of the use of these funds upon request. The allocation provides funding to cover per session activities and OTPS costs including teachers, paraprofessionals, school aides, security, guidance counselors, postage and supplies. An amount of \$12,645 will be allocated to the Office of Student Enrollment to cover administrative costs. The below allotments will be placed in "**TL One Time Allocation HS**".
