## SCHOOL ALLOCATION MEMORANDUM NO. 75, FY10

**SUBJECT:** **Students with Interrupted Formal Education (SIFE) and Long-Term English Language Learners (LTE) Grant**

---

This memorandum provides resources to schools participating in the Students with Interrupted Formal Education (SIFE) and Long-Term ELLs (LTE) Initiative. Participating schools were required to submit program proposals which were approved by the Chief Achievement Office. First time funding recipients received up to \$100,000 to assist with costs associated with building programs while past grant recipients received up to \$50,000 to continue effective programs. School allocations are summarized on the attached table.

In its sixth year of implementation, the SIFE/LTE Initiative provides funding, technical assistance, professional development and networking opportunities so that schools develop and implement new ways to serve these struggling students. According to the 2008-09 BESIS, one out of every ten ELLs has been identified as SIFE some time during their tenure. ELLs who have received services for more than six years and are typically over-aged, known as Long-term ELLs, make up even more of the overall ELL population (14%) in New York City. In order to serve this high-needs population, the initiative has been refined and is tailored to include professional development and instructional service options for grant recipients using recommended SIFE/LTE Academic Intervention Programs.

The SIFE/LTE Initiative allows schools to purchase recommended and/or proven effective interventions and/or professional development to support middle and high school teachers with research-based strategies, practices, materials and curricula to strengthen literacy, mathematics and technology skills in targeted populations of ELLs. Schools can also use funding to structure programs to increase parent engagement in the academic lives of SIFE and LTEs.

Program schools will create learning communities based on the model they choose to implement. ELL Specialists in collaboration with School Support Organization network leaders will visit each school during the year to support program implementation, evaluate program effectiveness, and document best practices. Schools will send appropriate representatives for professional development according to recommendations of their chosen intervention programs. Also, all sites will be required to submit student rosters and final reports evaluating program implementation, materials and data collected to determine if students met goals and objectives stated in the submitted proposals.

Allocations will be placed in each school's budget under the allocation category **TL SIFE ELL** or **TL SIFE ELL HS**. Schools should schedule their allotment in accordance with their approved program proposal.
