SUBJECT: ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS (ELA) SCORING OTPS ALLOCATION

This memorandum presents funds to defray costs associated with the scoring of the mandated New York State English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics tests in grades 3-8. The allotments for each Integrated Service Center (ISC) presented in the table below cover Other Than Personnel (OTPS) costs for supplies associated with scoring. Allowable supplies are listed in the "Scoring Site Operations Manual" or are covered as needed by each ISC through the scoring process.

The allocation supports the Chancellor's Children First reform initiative whose goal is to ensure that all students are on track for timely graduation and are acquiring the knowledge and skills they need. In light of his vision, all students in grades 3 through 8 take tests in English language arts and math during the school year.
