SUBJECT: **Title I ELL Enrichment Grant**

This memorandum provides resources to schools participating in the Title I ELL Enrichment Grant. Participating schools were required to submit program proposals, which were approved by the Office of English Language Learners (ELLs). School allocations are summarized on the attached table.

The Title I ELL Enrichment Grant provides additional funding to high-needs schools in Title I districts that did not meet the NCLB Title III Annual Measurable Assessment Objectives (AMAOs) as of 2008-2009 for 2, 3 and 4 years, and/or were in high-ELL districts. This funding supports programs that strengthen existing and create new opportunities for ELLs to meet State academic and student achievement standards, and ensure equitable opportunities for all ELLs.

Awarded schools must:

- Use funds to supplement existing ELL programs and services provided through Title I and Title III.
- Use funds to expand services for ELLs other than core mandated CR Part 154 services.
- Leverage their internal resources and the support offered by networks to improve their ELL programs
- Agree to present their learning at a portfolio presentation session.
- Agree to be a part of the evaluation of the Title I ELL Enrichment Grant.

Program schools are required to send a team composed of a school administrator and a pedagogue to three Office of ELLs-provided capacity building sessions. Additionally, ELL Specialists and/or Compliance and Performance Specialists from the Office of ELLs will visit each school to support program implementation, evaluate program effectiveness, and document best practices. Title I Grant ELL Enrichment Schools are strongly encouraged to work with high-performing ELL schools that participated in the Accelerating Achievement for ELLs (AAELL) Work Group, and make every effort to integrate some of the principles¹ that were derived from this group.

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1. ¹Having high expectations and a clear and deliberate theory of action.
 2. Monitoring student progress and adjust or modify their actions for results based on a wide variety of evidence.
 3. Designing and enacting practices based on the characteristics of their students and communities.
 4. Practicing purposeful collaboration at multiple levels.
 5. Keeping keen focus on academic content.
 6. Honing the capacity of staff to enrich language development and academic concepts and skills.

Allocations will be placed in each school's budget under the allocation category [Title I ELL Program](#). Schools should schedule their allotment in accordance with their approved programs.
