## SCHOOL ALLOCATION MEMORANDUM NO. 49, FY11

**SUBJECT:** **LEAD TEACHER ALLOCATION**

The Lead Teacher Program was established as a result of the latest collective bargaining agreement. Lead teachers spend half their time teaching classes and half their time serving as professional development resources for their schools. Since the program is intended to target schools with the highest need, applications were made available to schools based on 2005-06 Accountability Office data for each school including their peer group rank and progress report overall percentile rank. Allocation amounts for each school can be viewed in the attached table.

In elementary schools, lead teachers work as a pair; two lead teachers have responsibility for one regular class. They share a preparation period, and spend half the day teaching their class and half providing professional support to teaching staff. In middle schools and high schools, a lead teacher teaches three regular classes per day and provides professional support to teaching staff three periods per day. In addition, lead teachers attend five days of professional development prior to the start of the work year and four hours per month outside of the normal workday, according to a plan set and approved by the applicable Regional Superintendent. Lead teachers receive a supplemental salary of \$10,710. This salary premium is prorated based on the United Federation of Teachers (UFT) contractual agreement. Aside from this bonus, the lead teachers will not receive additional compensation for the five workdays and the four hours per month.

Programmatic information is provided by Division of Human Resources.

This allocation provides funding for 40% of the cost for the pair of Lead Teachers. The teachers will be funded based on the school's average teacher salary plus a \$10,710 salary premium. The funds for this allotment were placed in the "[TL Lead Teacher](#)" allocation category.
