Funds would expand the farm market to include cooking and other food preparation instruction for PS 11 families and neighbors. Pop: PS 11 families and other Chelsea residents, many of whom are low-income and cannot afford fresh/healthy food. The farm market is at PS 11 in Chelsea, 320 West 21 Street. Cooking/food preparation instruction would occur with community partners/restaurants to expand healthy food choices to our community at-risk for food poverty. Funds are requested for our Director to expand operation, outreach, and partnership formation. Receipt, display, and distribution of produce, plus finances are handled by student and parent volunteers under our Director's supervision. Sales are made by 3rd grade students who hone math skills and teach nutrition basics to customers. Word-of-mouth brings non-school customers from 21st Street and roughly a two-block radius from the school. Funds also would support a newsletter and blog to increase outreach and publicize more widely our farm market and would enable us to further develop our urban farm infrastructure into a sustainable community
