## SCHOOL ALLOCATION MEMORANDUM NO.75, FY11

**SUBJECT:** **City Year New York Allocation**

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The City Year New York program is a public/private partnership between the New York City Department of Education (DOE), AmeriCorps and private entities. City Year organizes 17 to 24-year-olds to volunteer for a year of full-time service to their community and country. In New York City, City Year focuses on high-need public schools, placing City Year AmeriCorps volunteers as school-based mentors and tutors. The program's goal is to help children attend school regularly by addressing social-emotional needs and supporting classroom instruction. Through interaction with City Year mentors, children learn about global issues, leadership, conflict resolution and acquire life-long social and academic skills. The program nurtures both the volunteers and the children by setting examples and by inspiring them to bring their skills back to their communities. At each school, City Year New York provides school day, lunch-time and after school programs, as well as a winter break program.

The Department of Education funds will primarily support staff and Americorps members' salaries, which comprise no more than 50% of all costs. Costs would include portions of staff salaries, benefits, AmeriCorps members' stipends, as well as fees for consultants and other non-personnel expenses. Staff and AmeriCorps volunteers are primarily based in schools. Tax levy resources are being provided for this venture as presented in the attached table.

The City Year New York allocation is displayed below. Funds will be auto-moded into the "[TL City Year New York](#)" allocation category under object code 685, program name "City Year."
