SUBJECT: OPSR College Advising Seminars

The Office of Postsecondary Readiness has run a pilot College and Career Planning Seminar during SY2011-12 with the goal of improving postsecondary readiness outcomes. As a result Networks that have been engaged in the CFI College and Career Planning seminar in SY2011-12 have developed action plans for schools to raise the bar on college and career access. Each network has developed a school entry point across a set of schools K-12, and will pilot several measures among teachers and staff. School level entry points include: developing postsecondary inquiry teams, setting up an effective college office, develop future-focused advisory programs. The per session is required to support the school level action planning, which will be documented and scaled across the participating network.

The amount of per session depends on the size of school and extent of program being implemented (i.e. some programs will require more hours to set up than others, or will involve more or fewer teachers). Funds should be scheduled in [TL C4E College and Career Planning](#).

School Allocations

- Schools must expend all funds by June 30, 2012
- Funds are to be used for *per-session only*.
- The school principal is responsible for monitoring all allocations
- For auditing purposes, schools are required to keep accurate records of their expenditures.
