SUBJECT: Title I Neglected and Delinquent

In accordance with the No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act of 2001, neglected and delinquent students attending institutional facilities are to receive supplemental instructional services. Institutions for neglected children are covered under Title I, Part A, and, as such, follows the County Provision and utilizes the borough per capita developed in the Title I (basic) Allocation for eligible schools (**SAM #8**). Institutes for delinquent children are covered under Title I, Part D, which appropriates specific amounts for delinquent children. Details of the two allocations are presented in Tables 1 and 2 respectively.

To ensure compliance of the NCLB Act regarding appropriate use of funds and services rendered to eligible students, two requirements and activities must be implemented and documented. The items below reflect the collection of standard documentation as follows:

- Meet with neglected and/or delinquent facility representatives to discuss program needs and services to be provided. Proof of these meetings must be presented via agenda, attendance rosters, and handouts; and
- Develop and implement in conjunction with the neglected or delinquent facility, a formal agreement that delineates the roles and responsibilities of each entity regarding Title I, Part D funding and services for residents in the facility.

The first bullet is more of a district and school based activity, where meetings are focused throughout the year on the academic need of students. The second bullet is a central activity involving a formal agreement between the New York City Department of Education and the facility. Again, meetings held with the neglected and delinquent institutions must be documented.

Title I Neglected and Delinquent allocations will be placed in the D79 and D97 locations via the Galaxy Transfer Utility. The allocation categories are **Title I Neglected D79, Title I Delinquent D79, Title I Neglected CW and Title I Delinquent CW.**
