SUBJECT: Assessment Practice Grant (APG) Allocations

Through the Periodic Assessment Program, the Department of Education (DOE) is providing funding to schools across Clusters that applied for and were accepted to a competitive grant program titled Assessment Practice Grant (APG) Program. The grant program assists schools in developing and using their own assessment techniques and tools to achieve the educational objectives of the Division of Academics, Performance, and Support's Periodic Assessment (PA) Program.

The intent of the APG Program is to assist schools in developing effective team-based practices around the use of formative assessments. The APG Program supports schools and cohorts in the design and development of Common Core aligned assessments through collaborative teaming. In addition, APG supports teacher professional development for the use of formative assessments that align instruction and curricular resources to the Common Core and to the Common Core Instructional Shifts. All schools and cohorts in the APG Program are expected to share their work with the DOE in accordance with program requirements.

All DOE schools, grades K-12, were eligible to apply to the Assessment Practice Grant Program through a rigorous and competitive application process in July 2012 as either an individual school or as part of a cohort of schools. Sixteen individual schools were selected to participate in the APG program and received \$10,000 to complete and share their work with the DOE. Thirty schools, across five cohorts, were selected to participate in the APG Program as cohort member schools and received \$8,000 to complete and share their work with the DOE.

APG funds are targeted toward the schools' design, implementation, interpretation, and communication of formative assessments and results, and can be used toward aligning their school-based assessments with the Common Core Learning Standards (CCLS). In addition, funds can be used toward per session and per diem coverage to allow educators to meet in teams for activities related to data analysis, adjustments to instruction and unit planning, and to attend professional development opportunities related to the CCLS and/or the use or design of formative assessments. Allocations can also be used to collect and prepare artifacts and resources to be delivered to the Periodic Assessment team at the conclusion of the grant program.

The allocation is conditioned on schools complying, whenever applicable, with the requirements set forth in the Division of Academics, Performance and Support's Periodic Assessment Program.

The attached table displays the allocation for each individual or cohort member school that was approved for PA's Assessment Practice Grant Program for 2012-13. Funds should be scheduled in the Galaxy allocation category **TL Assessment Practice Grant Program** and **TL Assessment Practice Grant Program CW**.
