**SUBJECT:** School Success Grant

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The School Success Grant (SSG) will provide supplementary funding to targeted groups of schools designated as struggling schools, based on Department of Education (DOE) and New York State Education Department (NYSED) accountability measures. Funding will support school improvement activities to improve student achievement.

- a) **Thirty-eight [38] schools that are currently phasing out or undergoing performance-related grade truncations and are not receiving School Improvement Grant (SIG) funding.** For our lowest-performing schools, the DOE proposes a strategy of undergoing a process of phase out or grade truncation and replacement with a new school. Phase out schools that are receiving federal School Improvement Grant (SIG) funds in 2013-14 are not eligible for SSG funds
  
- b) **Twenty-five [25] schools that were part of the Early Engagement (EE) process during the 2012-13 school year and are not eligible for other DOE supplemental funding in 2013-14 (Transitional Relief for SIG Funding Loss or Blueprint Assistance Funds).** Every year the DOE reviews the performance data of all schools citywide and we identify our most struggling schools for intensive support or intervention. 25 schools that were identified as amongst our most struggling but were ultimately not proposed for phase out or performance-related grade truncation will be implementing plans to improve student achievement.

### **Guidelines for School Success Grant (SSG) Allocations**

Schools receiving this allocation must refer to their approved Comprehensive Educational Plan (CEP) in determining the most appropriate use of these funds to support improvement efforts. These funds may be used to support direct services to students including expanded learning time, enrichment, and academic intervention services; professional development and collaboration activities for staff; and strategies to increase parental and student involvement. Please see Galaxy for the specific cost factors for your allocation category (cost factors are subject to modification during the school year).

Grant period: funds expire on June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2014.

**Allocation Methodology**

Allotments were calculated on a pupil basis using enrollment projections for school year 2013-2014 as of May 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2013. Allotment will not be adjusted according to final registers. Each school will receive an allocation of \$286 per student.

Funds should be scheduled in the following Allocation Categories:
