**SUBJECT:** City Year New York

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The City Year New York (CYN Y) program is a public/private partnership between the New York City Department of Education (DOE), AmeriCorps and private entities. City Year organizes 17 to 24 year-olds to volunteer for a year of full-time service to their community and country. CYN Y works in twenty-two (22) high-need public schools, placing CYN Y AmeriCorps volunteers as school-based mentors and tutors. Each participating school receives full-time services from a team of 8 to 16 Corps Members. Corps Members provide academic support, attendance monitoring and incentives, positive behavior support, after-school programming, and in-school programs and activities, such as assemblies and celebrations.

The program's goal is to help children attend school regularly by addressing social-emotional needs and supporting classroom instruction. Through interaction with CYN Y mentors, children learn about global issues, leadership, and conflict resolution and acquire life-long social and academic skills. The program nurtures both the volunteers and the children by setting examples and by inspiring them to bring their skills back to their communities. DOE funds roughly one-third of the total program cost. The DOE funds primarily support personnel costs including portions of CYN Y program staff salaries and Corps Members' stipends.

The CYN Y allocation is displayed in Table 1. Each participating school receives \$118,909 in tax levy funds. Funds will be auto scheduled into the **TL City Year New York** allocation category under "Educational Consultants" object code 685, program name "**City Year**." No budgetary action is required by the participating schools as OSYD will manage all the funds to be pre-encumbered for the CYN Y contract.
