**SUBJECT:** FY 2017 City Council Member Items

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Resources have been placed into the Department of Education's budget by the City Council to support specific school programs, goals and vendor costs. This memorandum allocates those resources.

For FY 2017, only City Council items that are allocated to schools and central offices but are earmarked for specific vendors will require Mayor's Office of Contract Services (MOCS) approval. City Council funds that are identified for specific schools no longer require MOCS approval.

### **Items Identified Specifically for Schools**

City Council funds have been allocated directly to schools and are listed on the attached Tables 1 (Summary) and 2 (School Details). Funds will be allocated to schools in the "**TL City Council Member Items**" allocation category.

### **Approved ("Cleared") by the Mayor's Office of Contract Services (MOCS)**

City Council funds that have been allocated to schools to support vendor services are listed on the attached Tables 1 (Summary) and 2 (School Details). A discrete allocation category has been created for these city council items, "**TL City Council Member Items Vendors**". Funds will be auto-scheduled into object code 685.

### **Items Pending Approval ("Uncleared") by the Mayor's Office of Contract Services (MOCS)**

City Council Member items that have not been cleared by the Mayor's Office of Contract Services (MOCS) are held in a reserve. Once cleared, allocations will be posted into Galaxy and the Borough Field Service Centers (BFSC) will be notified.

Schools are required to follow purchasing guidelines as per the Standard Operation Procedure Manual.
